III. JUDGEMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Strengths

Community Unity-There seems to be an undertone of division within the school community that I believe stems from the consolidation of the Decatur and Lyons school districts. This division is not always clearly seen from the outside or even outright; rather this division is noticed in the little nuances like small comments, social groups that sometimes form, and tone that individuals (including some staff) talk about a specific group or city. This division I have notice applies to those from other communities that attend LDNE like Walthill.

Recommendations

Community Unity-Since the new administration has come on board (Fred Hansen and Andrew Cronin), it seems as if things are on their way up and that a lot of work has already been done to remedy this. The thing that can continue to be done are treating students equally both in positive and negative reinforcements and in opportunities (i.e. shuttle van).

1) Organize a school event in Decatur. This can be a celebration, some sort of tournament, or misc. activity. The main thing is that it needs to be something that would interest most of the LDNE community. The emphasis seems to on the Lyons side of LDNE. Holding a positive school in Decatur will hopefully show that both towns are on the same team.

School Pride

- 1) Ensure that the faculty, staff, and support staff take pride in LDNE. Just as much energy needs to go into the staff as does the students because they are related.
- 2) Secondary Field Day-The elementary seems to just take a day here and there just to have fun as a school. Why can't the secondary do this? I don't know what this would look, but maybe bring music, games, activities, etc.
- 3) At one of the sub-district volleyball game a group brought signs and props for the fans to show their pride. At the homecoming game there was a black out. More things like this need to be planned to show pride in ones school.
