

Social-Emotional Well-Being Survey



Relevance of the Social-Emotional Well-Being Survey

The survey offers your school the opportunity to survey your students and receive information on a wide variety of social, emotional and behavioural outcomes in your student population.

There are versions of the survey suitable for every year level of schooling. You are able to track your students' growth and changing attitudes throughout their school life.

Focus of the Social-Emotional Well-Being Survey

The focus of the Social-Emotional Well-Being Survey is wide-ranging and comprehensive. There are three broad elements in the survey. These elements are interrelated and feedback from the survey enables your school to examine key areas that impact on student learning.

The three broad elements are

- students' overall levels of positive social-emotional well-being
- 2. students' social-emotional-motivational competencies
- **3.** students' observations of 'good practices' in their home, school and community.

Survey features

The survey enables you to get feedback from every year level within your school.

Your school will choose which year levels and the number of students to be surveyed.

- Preparatory—Year I survey is completed by teachers on their students.
- Year 2—4 survey completed by students. There is a parallel teacher survey for these students.
- Years 5–12 survey completed by students. In this survey students are also requested to provide feedback about their perceptions of 'good practice' in their home, school and community. Again there is also a parallel teacher survey for these students.

Both teachers' and students' responses are anonymous and are recorded in scannable booklets.



Report

The report(s) sent to your school are confidential. If appropriate your school is sent a separate Preparatory—Year I report.

Each report contains data at a range of levels including percentage responses to each statement. Analysis is completed to enable your school to make comparisons between different year levels and gender.

Feedback is provided about

- students' Social-Emotional Well-Being
- specific problem areas
- key competencies that support the academic achievement of students as well as their social-emotional well-being
- students' perception of good practice in their home, school and community (Years 5–12 survey only).

In addition, guidelines are provided as to how to use the data.

School clusters can also choose to have the data aggregated for an additional fee.
