

Reflexive Pronouns

Reflexive pronouns are similar to intensive pronouns. The difference between the two is that intensive pronouns aren't essential to a sentence's meaning.

Meanwhile, reflexive pronouns are. Also, they're used when the subject and the object of a sentence refer to the same person or thing. These pronouns end in -self or -selves. They are:

- myself
- yourself
- himself
- herself
- itself
- ourselves
- yourselves
- themselves

For example:

- I told **myself** not to spend all my money on new shoes.
- You're going to have to drive **yourself** to the restaurant today.
- We gave **ourselves** plenty of extra time.
- They bought **themselves** a new car.
