Personal Pronouns

<u>Personal pronouns</u> are used as a substitute for a person's name. There are two kinds: subjective and objective pronouns. That is, they either act as the subject of the sentence or the object of the sentence.

As the subject of a sentence, they are:

- you
- he
- she
- it
- we
- they

For example:

- They went to the store.
- I don't want to leave.
- He runs a great shop in town.
- You can't leave, either.

As the object of the sentence, they are:

- me
- you
- her
- him
- it
- us
- them

For example:

- Please don't sit beside me.
- Go talk to her.
- Mary put the gift under it.
- Don't look at them.
